President's Corner

Building a new home on Gravel Lake has been both a challenging and rewarding process. We consider ourselves fortunate to be able to do so! It started with a significant rain event and runoff from the road side that eventually overwhelmed our home, accelerating our plan to rebuild. As we have progressed with our plans we've tried to be thoughtful about our impact on the lake. You've heard me talk about impervious surfaces and how they speed unfiltered water into the lake. Given that, we wanted to minimize our impervious surfaces (e.g. roofs, driveway, walkways). We chose to go up rather than out and to incorporate our garage into our build; we went from three structures down to one. Additionally, we've thought about where excess water is coming from (i.e. our roof and downspouts, the hard swale road that concentrates water to the low part of Chamberlin Drive) and where it will go (e.g. our yard, the lake). We've chosen to create several rain gardens to handle some flow as well as creating a small "prairie" of deep-rooted native plants to further help filter and absorb water before it gets to the lake. We're also planning to make a short walkway from our per-



meable driveway to our door out of permeable pavers. Of course, we can't stop the extreme weather events or the concentrated runoff from the roadway entirely, but we can put a dent in it. When we think about other highly developed lakes in Michigan (e.g. Austin, Eagle, Macatawa, Spring, any lake in Oakland County) that have suffered from harmful algal blooms, unwanted nutrient loading, and heavy sedimentation, it motivates us to do as much as we can to mitigate the impacts from excess runoff. Certainly, there are many, often competing, considerations to manage when building a home (e.g. cost, material availability, size, location). I can understand how considering lake health can fall to the bottom of the list. That said, I hope that increasing awareness of development concerns and potential remedies encourages us to think more broadly about improvement projects and how we can adopt a lower impact mindset.

Low Impact Development Techniques Summary

As we continue to develop the land surrounding Gravel Lake, there are various techniques available for consideration to manage stormwater. The goal is to filter, store, evaporate, or detain as much runoff stormwater as possible. Ultimately, this allows for less contaminants to enter the lake, allowing for a healthier lake.

- Rain Gardens: reduce runoff with a shallow, planted catch-basin
- · Bioretention/bioswale: offset impervious surfaces with a planted area that slows and directs runoff
- Rain barrel or cistern: holds excess water for future use or allowing more time for soil absorption
- · Vegetated roof: fully or partially planted roof to capture more rainwater
- Permeable pavers/pavement: materials specifically designed to allow water to filter to soil and reduce runoff
- Minimize impervious surfaces: achieving living space through multiple vs. single floors, choosing techniques above, managing building size relative to lot size



Purple Martins and Their Migration Patterns in Southwest Michigan



Purple Martins, the largest species of swallows in North America, are known for their remarkable migration patterns. Each year, these aerial insectivores travel thousands of miles between their breeding grounds in North America and their wintering grounds in South America. In southwest Michigan, Purple Martins arrive in late spring, around April or early May, after a long migration from the Amazon basin in Brazil. The region's abundance of wetlands and open fields, rich in insects, provides the ideal habitat for nesting and feeding during the warmer months.

If you have seen a birdhouse "condo" then you've likely been witness to a Purple Martin attraction. During the summer, Purple Martins form breeding colonies, often choosing to nest

in human-provided housing. They exhibit a monogamous mating system, where males compete for nesting sites to attract females. Females typically select males based on the quality of the nesting site, favoring well-maintained houses or gourds that offer protection from predators and weather. Once a pair forms, they work together to raise their brood, which can consist of 3 to 7 eggs.

By late August to early September, after their young have fledged, Purple Martins begin their southward journey. The migration back to Brazil is triggered by decreasing daylight and cooler temperatures, prompting the martins to seek warmer climates where food is more abundant. In Michigan, especially near large water bodies like Lake Michigan and our very own Gravel Lake, communal roosts serve as stopover points before the birds continue their long trek south. The synchronized flocking of the Purple Martin can be something to behold, as these huge roosts can number in the tens of thousands. Additionally, this species of swallow takes off and lands together during times of flight. This year, you may have been lucky enough to witness thousands of the small swallows flying above the weed bed around dusk. Quite an amazing sight to behold, the birds would come out each night to feast on our native insects. Descending from high above the water's surface (even up to 500 feet above) in what seemed to be a coordinated dive, these incredibly skilled aerial hunters chow down on dragonflies, beetles, moths, and sometimes mosquitoes. Contrary to popular belief, mosquitoes are not the preferred meal size for the Martins, and they are often out much later after the birds have already settled in for the night.

Fun fact:


Purple Martins form such dense gatherings that you can see them on a weather radar. It's particularly noticeable in the early morning as the birds leave their roosts for the day, and looks like an expanding donut on the map.
