It seems like recruiting gets easier each year; thank you for that!! I attribute much of this to the strong sense of community we have and the above average interest many of you have in getting involved to continuously improve our association.

Your interest and enthusiasm has also been evident in our Gravel Lake Association survey. As I write this, we've received over 218 responses with many of you taking the time to provide detailed feedback in the write-in questions. The Board of Trustees will review all of this data to make sure we're on the right path and make changes where necessary. Thanks for taking the time to do this! Following are a sample of facts we've gleaned thus far (with more to come in the future).

- 35% of respondents make their primary home at Gravel Lake.
- 90% of respondents said that water quality should be the priority of the GLA while 51% chose social/community as the 2nd most common answer.
- 92% of respondents indicated they ALWAYS read the Gravel Laker cover-to-cover!
- 63% of respondents view the Facebook group frequently.
- 65% of respondents are aware of the recent water quality survey results. We'll work on that!

Shoreline Activities Requiring a DEQ Permit

- 1. Shoreline Protection—seawall, bulkhead, riprap, etc. (However, no permit is required for planting native plants on the shoreline!)
- 2. Permanent docks, permanent boat hoists—anything left in year-round (seasonal docks do not require a permit)
- 3. Beach sanding—placement of sand, pea stone, or other clean fill below the water line requires a permit (regardless of where it's placed, it's very likely going to end up in the lake; it's essentially fill)
- 4. Dredging or excavation—a soil erosion permit may be required in addition to a DEQ permit

The bowfin is a fish of many names. Most commonly called the dogfish, some of its other nicknames are the grindle, mudfish, cypress trout, beaverfish, or the lake lawyer. A natural-born survivor, this swift and efficient predator can be found throughout North America, and very commonly in lower Michigan.

The bowfin family dates back to the Jurassic period and has many features that have allowed it to survive and thrive for such a long period. One of these features is its gas bladder, similar to our lungs, that can hold air allowing the bowfin to survive out of water for up to 24 hours. This feature is particularly helpful during times of drought when the bowfin can become buried in mud. Another unique

characteristic is the "eye spot" near the tail fin of the bowfin, thought to be a defense mechanism against predators. The theory behind it, being that most predators would attack closer to the eyes, or head of a fish, and it is more likely to survive an attack to the tail rather than the head. It also may be a homing technique to aid the young bowfin as they swim after their father. A school of young bowfin fish is sometimes called a "bowfin ball" that is fiercely protected by the male until the little ones reach 3-4 inches in length. Bowfin thrive in weedy areas, vegetated sloughs, swamps, and can be found in lowly oxygenated ponds and lakes.

Although the bowfin used to be thought of as an invasive species due to their great hunting abilities, this is not actually the case. Because the bowfin only feed on the most abundant of species in their environment, including crayfish, minnows, or small game fish, they actually work to keep the ecosystem in check rather than degrading it. This diet can allow the bowfin to grow up to 21 pounds.

Identified by its long, stout, and slimy body, long dorsal fin and rounded tail fin, the bowfin also harbors a large mouth, full of sharp teeth, which makes them hard to handle and not so beloved among anglers.

The bowfin is sometimes mistaken for the snakehead which is a truly invasive species that can seriously change and harm any lake which it calls home. Though they are similar in appearance, there are some distinguishing differences. If you do indeed suspect that you have caught a snakehead from our lake, please immediately remove the fish and call the DNR. The DNR will then be able to confirm or deny that the fish is actually a snakehead and they will take it from there. Please note these helpful pictures that outline the differences between the two fish. Because snakeheads have no natural predators and can survive out of water for 3-5 days, they are very capable of quickly multiplying and taking over a stable ecosystem. So be kind to our native bowfin, but keep an eye open for its look alike, the snakehead!




