Boat Wash Update

The GLA Board of Trustees held a special meeting to review questions and answers with boat wash producer, CD3. Recall that the goal of a boat wash is to reduce the spread of aquatic invasive species via our public access. During our meeting, we covered a wide range of topics including installation costs, upkeep costs, funding options, placement, monitoring, model options, legal/governmental requirements, and funding sources. Key highlights include:

-Placement of a boat wash station on our site is viable, and we have multiple options.

-Early success has been seen on lakes in Michigan and Minnesota.

-Funding could come from GLA, our aquatic plant special assessment district fund, and grants.

Currently, the board is interested in investigating the availability of grants before proceeding much further. Our next step is to share more details and get feedback ideally at our next membership meeting. Questions or comments can be directed to Craig DeSimone at cucad4@hotmail.com.

Smallmouth Bass

Smallmouth bass are part of the black bass family, which includes largemouth bass, spotted bass, redeye bas, and Suwannee bass. These fishes are native to the temperate zones of North America but have spread to other areas of the continent due to stocking. The smallmouth can be described as brown in color with darker brown or black vertical bands along its sides, and dark brown or red eyes. Smallmouth bass can range in size, but on average a full-grown adult can measure in around 15 inches. Smallmouths that are found in lakes are much heftier. River "smallies" are slimmer, as the current of the river serves as a sort of treadmill which keeps the river fish trimmer than their lakebased brothers.



Smallmouths will spawn in Michigan from mid-May through June. Nests are generally made in an area of little or no current or traffic. The male smallmouth uses his tail fin to sweep the bottom of the water bed clear of gravel and silt to make the nest for the female to deposit her eggs. It is interesting to note that he always does this within 150 yards or so of his previous season's nest. Once spawning occurs, the female will leave to seek another mate or continue on her own, while the male guards the 2,500-10,000 eggs for up to a week until the young fry hatch. (Fry refers to the recently hatched fish). The male will also keep watch over the fry for another 12 or so days until they disperse and journey out of the nest. Generally, a full-grown adult will live to be 10-12 years old and average somewhere around 15 inches in length. A trophy smallmouth bass will be 20+ inches long. In my research, the largest recorded smallmouth bass that I came across was 22lbs!

Smallmouth bass that live in lakes may not be practicing social distancing these days, as they often swim in schools. After spawning season, they tend to go into deeper waters but have been known to be caught on a fly. Because of the spirited nature of this fish, it is one of the most fun to catch. If you like a good challenge, the smallmouth bass will always put up a good fight. Michigan is known as one of the best places to fish for these little fighters and just last year at least two 20+ inch smallies were caught right in our very own lake!

A wise man once told me that the respectable fisherman or fisherwoman will avoid fishing for smallmouth bass during mid-May to June during spawning season. This allows the next generation of smallmouth to have the best chance of survival and growth. If you do catch one during this time, please consider catch-and-release. It is important for the ecology at Gravel Lake.

Also of note, a solid rule of thumb for good fish handling is to keep the fish wet. Makes sense, right? If you just have to snap a picture, try to keep it out of the water for as little time as possible. Hold your breath as you take the fish out of the water... when you need air, they need water! The best bait to use to catch a smallmouth has to do with what is available to the fish in their natural habitat. Smallmouth will eat smaller fish. crayfish, insects, tadpoles, and frogs, and are mainly carnivorous. Because of the prevalence and availability of frogs and small fish in our lake, fishing baitfish, and frog patterns are a great way to target smallmouths! 



Shaw Road Update

The GLA continues to pursue a traffic study in conjunction with the Porter Township Board. Such a study is necessary for any real improvements on Shaw Road. The GLA board approved some funding to support the study, but requires more information on the parameters and output of the study in order to move forward. Additionally, the GLA board has resolved to not only pursue signage, but an expanded shoulder to better accommodate pedestrian traffic where conditions aren't ideal. To be clear, we are limited by the results of a traffic study and township/county budgets. Still, we'll pursue the best option available. We will continue to provide periodic updates.




