

Name: Patricia Walter

Where are you from and what do you do?

I am from Elmhurst, IL and I am a retired RN.

Tell us about your family.

I was married to my husband, Paul Walter, for 49 years before he passed away in 2014. I have three children: Mary, Edward, and Kathy. I also have six grandchildren: Connor, Kylie, Philip, Kevin, Bailey, and Joey.

Describe your home and its location.

Moles

You've likely heard of moles, but never seen one. These industrious, subterranean mammals live the vast majority of their lives underground. They spend their time digging intricate tunnel systems searching for food. In fact, moles can hollow out a 160-foot burrow in one night. (The human equivalent would be digging a half-mile tunnel in the same amount of time.) Moles can dig a tunnel at a speed of about 15 feet per hour. They are certainly equipped to do so, with their powerful forelimbs and long, shovel-like paws.



Moles have very underdeveloped eyes and thus, poor vision. Though not blind, moles can really only see light and movement. They also have very sensitive snouts and rely on their sense of smell to help them find their next meal. Moles feast on insects, insect larvae, grubs, and earthworms, and they consume at least half their body weight in earthworms per day. Contrary to popular belief, moles do not eat the roots of plants. (Their tunnels can, however, kill plants by displacing roots.) Moles are perceived as pests, yet they do their part in the ecosystem by aerating the soil, thus allowing for more water to be absorbed and vegetation to grow.

Moles can be found all around world with the exception of South America and Antarctica. There are seven species in North America alone. Acceptable habitats include meadows, grasslands, woodlands, sand dunes, and wetlands. They can also live in urban areas. You can find moles pretty much anywhere that has dirt. (They tend to stay away from acidic soil, though.) Moles can survive underground for a long time and have evolved to be able to live in environments with low levels of oxygen. They are most active after rain, as they like to dig in soft, wet soil. Moles are active year-round,



though they may reduce activity in excessive heat or cold periods.

Females give birth in underground tunnels to 3-4 pups at a time. Baby moles grow quickly and can live independently at a young age. They are weaned at 4-5 weeks and leave the nest at 33 days. By 5-6 weeks they leave their mother and home tunnel completely. Most species will grow to about 8-10 inches in length, including the tail. Adults weigh 3-5 ounces.

The lifespan of a mole is no more than three years for most species, and they are solitary animals for the vast majority of their lives. Three to five moles per acre of land is considered a lot. They are only interested in other moles for mating purposes. Other than that, they are quite content to continue working on their extensive network of tunnels alone.

The tunnels that the moles create are about two inches in diameter. There are two types of tunnels; the permanent tunnels are 8-23 inches below the surface, and the temporary tunnels are right under the surface. They use the tunnels to travel, and they even dig special "rooms" at the ends of the tunnels that serve various purposes such as bedrooms and birthing areas.


