### Boat Parade—Friday, July 5 immediately after Taps (sunset)

Theme: Glow stick party!

Gather your family and friends for an evening boat cruise. Wear white and decorate yourselves with light-up jewelry and glow sticks. Please take two laps. Judges will be at the Gordon's dock on Gebhard beach. The winning boat will receive a \$50 gift card to Wakeside Marine. On your second lap, you'll be waived in to claim your prize.

#### Kids Games—Saturday, July 6 at 10am

Who: Kids ages 12 and under are welcome to participate

Where: Willow Beach Grocery front (lakeside) lawn What: Participants will be divided into age groups upon arrival and matched up with volunteers to play yard/relay games. Groups will rotate to different stations. Goody bag and treats will be handed out at 11am.

#### Paddle Boat Regatta—Saturday, July 6 at 6pm

We hope you are ALL excited for the most anticipated event of the season! The race location, format, starting line, and finish line are the same as last year.

PFDs are required for all participants.

Rules are as follows:

1. All participants are required to have a PFD on their vessel during the race. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

- 2. Throwing water balloons into the channel during the race is strictly prohibited. Water balloons pose a safety issue and they are an environmental concern for our lake waters and wildlife.
- 3. High powered hoses are not allowed out of concern for safety. While this is a fun event, it should be fun for everyone, including the small children who would like to participate.
- 4. Spectators are not allowed to swim in the channel during the race, nor to attempt to flip racers out of concern for safety.

Race divisions are as follows: Kids (12 and under) 1-person kayak, Kids (12 and under) paddle boat, Adult stand-up paddleboard, Adult 1-person kayak, Adult 2-person kayak, Adult 2-person chain-driven paddle boat, and Adult 2-person classic paddle boat

Please note: If one person in your paddle boat is older than 12, you will be bumped to the adult division. Trophies will be given to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each division.

#### Fun Run 5K-Sunday, July 7 at 9am

The Gravel Lake 5K is back this year. The start and finish line will be near the Willow Beach Grocery sign at Lakeview Court and Gebhard Drive. The race will be a complete lap around Gravel Lake in a clockwise path. Trophies will be awarded to the top three males and top three females overall, and 1st through 5th place ribbons will be awarded to the following age groups for each gender:

6 and under, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-19, 20-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40+

Water and light refreshments will be provided at the finish. There is no registration necessary, and there is no fee. If you'd like to volunteer to keep runners safe on Shaw Road or help with timing, please contact Jen Micheli (jmicheli7@hotmail.com).

Not a runner? You can still participate! You could: provide water on a table outside your home, blast pump-up music (please try to keep it appropriate for all ages), put out a sprinkler for the runners to run through, and/ or hang out roadside and cheer on the runners! Your participation will make this even better! The award ceremony will take place near the starting line promptly at 10am.


#### **Goodbye To Our Gravel Lake Friends**



#### **Cicadas**

You may have heard a lot of buzz (pun intended) on the incoming emergence of cicadas this year. Cicadas are not invasive and while they may be rather annoying, they are harmless to plants, animals, and people. In Michigan, two species of cicadas garner attention: the periodical cicadas, which emerge en masse every 13 or 17 years, and the annual cicadas, which appear each year in spring and summer. There are about 15 broods, or species, of cicadas that emerge together at differing intervals. This year, we will see two periodical broods simultaneously: Brood X and Brood XIV.



#### Periodical Cicadas

Brood X, also known as the Great Eastern Brood,

is expected to emerge this year. Brood X encompasses both 13-year and 17-year cicadas, with different species emerging in different regions. Brood XIV is known as the "14 Year Periodical Cicada". These interesting insects live both above and below ground. Cicadas spend the majority of their lives underground as nymphs, feeding on sap from tree roots. After this developmental stage, they emerge from the ground, typically in late May to early June, to metamorphose into adults. Once above ground, the male cicadas produce their characteristic loud buzzing calls to attract mates, while females lay anywhere from a few dozen to a few hundred eggs in tree branches. After mating and egg-laying, the adult cicadas die, and their offspring drop from the trees and burrow into to the ground to begin the cycle anew.

#### Annual Cicadas

In contrast to periodical cicadas, annual cicadas emerge on a yearly basis. In Michigan, species such as the dog-day cicada (Tibicen spp.) and the scissor-grinder cicada (Neotibicen pruinosus) are commonly encountered during the summer months. Unlike their periodical counterparts, annual cicadas have shorter life cycles, spending two to five years underground as nymphs before emerging as adults. They typically emerge in late summer, with their buzzing calls serving as background music to warm summer days.

#### Cicadas (continued)

Both periodical and annual cicadas contribute to ecosystem dynamics in Michigan. As nymphs, they play roles in nutrient cycling and soil aeration. Upon emergence, their sheer numbers provide abundant food for predators, including birds, mammals, and predatory insects. Additionally, their feeding activities can influence tree growth and physiology, although the extent of these effects varies among species and ecosystems. Cicadas also contribute to pollination, albeit to a lesser extent than bees and other pollinators.

Whether it's the synchronized emergence of Brood X or XIV periodical cicadas, or the familiar buzz of annual species, cicadas are an integral part of Michigan's biodiverse habitats.




