### **President's Corner**

What's on my mind these days? Well, a lot! One topic I'd like to elaborate on is trees. With the frequency of storm damage and the amount of development we're experiencing, I wanted to give you some information and considerations.

Trees are very important for inland lakes and provide many benefits.

- Water quality—trees filter and slow down nutrient-laden runoff before it gets to the lake
- Shoreline protection—near-shore trees help stabilize shorelines
- Habitat and appeal—trees provide habitat for many important species and improve the aesthetic of the lake
- Water temperature—tree shade reduces water temperature which is more aquatic animal-friendly and is less hospitable to algae
- Air quality—trees remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and release oxygen
- Energy efficiency—shade cover reduces home cooling costs in the summer



- Swamp white oak (near shore, wet soil friendly)
- Black willow (near shore, wet solid friendly)
- Burr oak (tolerant of wet, dry, and average soils)

- Red & silver maple (great fall color)
- Tamarack (native evergreen)
- Bog & yellow birch (butterfly friendly)

### **Keeping the Night Sky Dark**

There's nothing guite like a clear southwest Michigan night—it seems impossible how many galaxies and stars can be visible to the naked eye. On busy lake weekends, however, it can be a little more challenging to enjoy all the beauty the sky has to offer.

Light pollution might sound like a highbrow city problem, but it's something from which any neighborhood can suffer. Don't get me wrong, we all appreciate a well-lit path and a bit of nighttime security. But when your neighbor's backyard looks like a minor league baseball stadium, it's tough to enjoy the subtle beauty of the night sky—or sleep with your curtains open.

The truth is, excessive outdoor lighting doesn't just obscure the stars; it can also disrupt local wildlife sleep and migratory patterns, interfere with natural sleep rhythms (yours and the raccoons'), and cause some neighborly grumbling. The good news? Thoughtful lighting doesn't mean going dark; it means pointing lights down, shielding them properly, and using only as much as you need. Think ambiance, not interrogation. Also, turning out those lights can save on the electric bill. According to the Dark Sky Association, 30% of outdoor light goes to waste, shining where it is not necessary or used, and this can really add up over the course of a year on wasted energy expenditures.

So let's all take a moment to look up and consider dialing back the brightness. Try fully shielded fixtures that focus light downward, installing motion sensors, or trying warmer color temperatures in your bulbs to help out. We'll all win with less light pollution—smaller bills, happier animals and neighbors, and better views!

### **Beautify a Corner of Your Shoreline**

Join your neighbors around the lake in planting a small grouping of native plants along a corner of your shoreline.

The association will be selling a small bundle of native plants (at cost) to plant along a small portion of your shoreline. The idea of a corner native plant shoreline sprouted from me seeing my mother's neighbors, Kathy and Marty Heneghan. They planted a small garden along a corner of their shoreline to provide stability of an area that muskrats had burrowed. A local nursery recommended native plants because they have long roots that support the integrity of the shoreline. The blooms were beautiful. They had three different types of plants; as one completed its bloom cycle, the next one would begin. I thought it was so pretty and such a good idea.

When speaking to Kathy about her garden, she said the planting worked to stabilize the shoreline and discouraged the muskrats burrowing. She shared how she loved the garden and enjoyed seeing butterflies, big bumble bees, and hummingbirds visiting the plants. She said, "The garden is so pretty. It's an attractive landscape that is beautiful and enhances the beauty of the shoreline."

Participating members will receive a bundle of 12 plants. Each bundle includes:

- 4 Southern Blue Flag (iris, purple, spring bloomer)
- 4 Brown Eyed Susans (yellow, early summer bloomer)
- 4 Swamp Milkweed (pink, summer bloomer)

The cost is \$25 per bundle.

These plants are specifically chosen because they require wet land and need to have wet roots. The nursery is providing these plants to us at wholesale pricing. We will only have a very limited amount available; this year we have plants for 24 families. I plan to have the plants available in August. If you are interested it reserving your bundle, please text Heidi Kussurelis at 734-395-6008. Please provide your name, beach, and address.

- 1. Helps filter run-off water that enters Gravel Lake, providing us cleaner water
- 2. Helps prevent erosion

### **Meet the McDevitts**

### Where are you from and what do you do?



### Beneath the Surface: An Essay About Gravel Lake

My memories of Gravel Lake always start the same way, with the sound of waves crashing and feet thudding on soft grass. There are always boats on the water and the sun in the sky in my mind. One distinct memory that comes to mind when I think of my lakehouse is when I was five. Everything at the lake, like the fish, the boats, and the water, felt bigger than life.

I had always wanted to get out on the water and ski or wakeboard like the adults. It was a clear July morning when my grandpa patted me on the back and said, "Today's the day you learn to water ski!" He treated it like an honor. almost like a ritual every young boy must go through to be crowned a member of Gravel Lake. I got super excited because I had always asked and wanted to learn. Honestly, I was terrified. I had seen how fast skiers got towed, and the thought of falling into the water at high speeds scared me. The skis looked like giant popsicle sticks glued together, and I was amazed anyone could manage to stand on water like this. My family wished me luck, and I got ready to go by putting my lifejacket on and strapping into the skis.



"Just keep your arms straight and let the boat do all the work," my dad said. "You'll be surprised how easy it is to stay up once you're out of the water." I nodded like I understood what he was saying. My heart thumped like a drum in my chest. My grandpa decided to take the pontoon boat out instead of the speedboat to ensure a calmer start for me. The engine roared to life, spitting out water behind it. I gripped the handle of the rope until my hands turned pale. The line straightened out, and I felt the boat slowly start to tug me forward. I yelled "Hit it!" and suddenly I was flying forward. My knees were bent, my arms were shaking, and my skis were slapping across the surface of the water. I remember thinking to myself, "I'm doing this! I'm really skiing right now!" It was a dream come true. Then I wiped out. Hard.

The skis went one way, and my arms went another. I swallowed what felt like half the lake. When I popped up out of the water, I expected disappointment. But the boat had circled back, and everyone was laughing, not at me, but with me. My grandpa gave me a big thumbs up from the back of the boat. At five years old, that was enough for me. I had accomplished a feat that was in my wishes for as long as I could remember.

Another fond memory I have is of the first fish I ever caught. I was four years old, and my family had taken our pontoon boat across the lake to my grandparents' house for a visit. It was in the summer, and better weather could not have been achieved. My grandfather let me try his old fishing pole to keep me occupied. The pole had a worn-out and taped-up handle and smelled like cedar and motor oil. He stood next to me, arms crossed, with a bucket hat on top of his head.

"You'll feel the fish pull before you see it," he said, pointing at the bobber. We didn't talk much after that. We just stood in silence, watching the water ripple and listening to the rustle of wind through the trees. Then, when all hope seemed lost, I suddenly felt a tug so strong it yanked my arms forward.


"Set the hook!" my grandfather shouted.

I pulled back with all of my weight, and the pole bent like a bow. Whatever was on the other end fought like it had no plans of giving up. My heart started racing, not out of fear, but out of excitement. After what felt like forever, I reeled in a giant, slick bass shining in the sun. I turned around with the behemoth on my hook, and my family cheered for me. I took a picture with the fish, but I didn't need one. That moment was carved into my memory like a painting into an ancient cave. As the sun dipped below the trees that night, everything felt still. There was still a calmness that wrapped around the lake like a blanket. I sat on the swing in my backyard, taking in the lake for everything it was worth. Behind me, the adults laughed and grilled burgers, and fireflies had started to blink out over the lawn.


At Gravel Lake, time moves differently. It stretches and folds around moments like these. My first time skiing, the first fish I ever caught, and many others are all held together by my favorite place on Earth. I wasn't just learning to ski or fish. I was learning how to try, how to fail, how to stand back up, and how to be patient when it mattered. Somewhere between catching that fish, getting up on those skis, and the silence that fell over the lake every night, I was becoming a different person. The lake made me braver, steadier, and a little more sure of who I was. For all these reasons, I will be forever in debt to the place that raised me.


